Marine Order 505 – Certificate of Competency

The following provides a summary of the requirements for a Mate <80m (NC) Certificate of Competency (CoC) under Marine Order 505.

What will I be able to do with this certificate? The holder of this certificate can:



Be second in command of a vessel <80 m long operating in the Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ)

How do I get this certificate?

To obtain a 5 year Mate <80m NC CoC you will need to have completed one of the following options for qualifying sea service (QSS):

While working in any deck capacity the applicant must have at least:

- 300 days' QSS on commercial vessels ≥12 m long, and a completed approved Master <35 m NC task book, or
- 600 days' QSS on commercial vessels ≥12 m long, without a task book.

Note: At least half (50%) of the QSS required for this certificate must be accrued in the five (5) years immediately prior to lodging your application.

Possible restriction – Mate <80m (NC)

Restricted to command only in sheltered waters:

A certificate will be restricted to command a vessel only in sheltered waters:

 If at least half of sea service required is not seaward of sheltered waters.

Restricted to daylight hours:

A certificate will be restricted to daylight hours:

• If the person is colour vision deficient.

What must I do to be eligible for a Mate < 80m NC CoC?

- Be at least 16 years when the certificate is issued.
- Evidence of sea service accrual in the form of:
- Record of sea service form 771 or
- Approved sea service log book or
- On board sea service record from your task book or

- Letter from the vessel operator, owner, master or chief engineer detailing your QSS.
- Evidence of Medical Fitness:
- Current AMSA medical (Certificate of medical fitness form 303) or
- Certificate of medical fitness for a NC certificate form 559.
- Evidence of Eyesight Test:
- Eyesight Test Certificate Application within the CoC application form 426 or
- Current AMSA medical (Certificate of medical fitness form 303).
- Complete an AMSA approved course of study
 Certificate 4 Master <35m NC course from an AMSA approved registered training organisation (RTO) as per MAR Maritime Training Package.
- HLTAID003 unit of competency Provide first aid or equivalent.
- Marine Radio Operators Certificate of Proficiency (MROCP) issued by the Australian Marine Communications Media and Media Authority, or higher qualification, or an equivalent qualification approved by the National Regulator.
- · Pay fee/s.
- Pass Final Assessment.
- Proof of identity.
- Passport-style photograph taken in the previous six months.

How do I keep this certificate?

To revalidate your certificate you must:

- Lodge a completed a CoC application form 426
- Accrue 120 days QSS as undertaking navigational tasks, for duties of the kind to which the certificate applies, accrued in the 5 years before the application.
- Evidence of Medical Fitness:
 - Current AMSA medical (Certificate of medical fitness form 303) or
- Certificate of medical fitness for a NC certificate form 559.
- HLTAID003 unit of competency Provide first aid or equivalent.

An applicant who does not meet the sea service requirement may instead:

- · Complete an approved renewal course, or
- Complete an approved final assessment, or
- Accrue 60 days QSS in the 6 months before the application, or
- Have other approved industry experience (e.g. state or territory marine agency assessor or operational employee, fleet manager, shore-side servicing, teaching at an approved training organisation for maritime studies, marine surveyor), or
- Complete a task book approved by the National Regulator for the certificate.

How to apply for a CoC – Initial Issue / Revalidation (select as required)

Lodge an application at Australia Post:

- Complete a CoC application form 426 online or download a pdf version and then complete it.
- Complete all sections of the form.
- Respond yes or no to all questions and statements in the application form.
- Complete all boxes (if the information requested is unknown or not applicable insert N/A).
- Download a pdf version of the form to generate your barcode.
- Print the form.
- Attach copies of all required documents.
- Sign the declaration.
- Submit your application and pay a fee at an AMSAcontracted Australia Post outlet.
- Provide proof of identity when you lodge your application.

AMSA may request reasonable evidence to confirm or verify any of the information provided as part of the application.

Commonwealth statutory declaration

A Commonwealth provided template can be used to make a declaration under the Statutory Declarations Act 1959. The original statutory declaration must be posted to AMSA SCS, GPO BOX 2181, Canberra ACT 2601.

The completed statutory declaration form tells us that you are sending us true copies of the originals or is a written statement which you sign and declare to be true before an authorised witness.
