AMSA REGULATORY CONSULTATION

Draft Marine Order 71 (Masters and deck officers) 2023 is open for external consultation until 24 May 2023

Who does this Order apply to?

Marine Order 71 (Masters and deck officers) 2014 (MO71) is issued under the Navigation Act 2012 and provides for the following:

- a. specifies standards of competence to be attained and other conditions to be satisfied by a person to be a qualified master or deck officer under the Navigation Act 2012; and
- b. gives effect to the International Convention on Standards of Training Certification and Watchkeeping (STCW).

What are the key changes?

This is a limited scope review that is not intended to result in significant policy changes other than to remove the ability to issue Master <24 m FG certificate and to update and modernise the marine order.

A summary of changes is:

- a. Removing the ability to issue Master <24 m FG certificate of competency as this certificate hasn't been issued since 2016 and is not required anymore.
- b. Updating and clarifying transitional arrangements in division 3 and schedule 5, relating to the expired Marine Order 3 Seafarer Certification.
- c. Updating the naming in marine Order 71, where required, to reflect the naming of new certificates of competency in Marine Order 505 (*Certificates of competency national law*).

Your comments

We invite you to make your comments on this draft Marine Order by using the specified criteria.

Commencement

The anticipated effect date for the reissued Marine Order 71 is **01 January 2024**.
