Marine Order 505 – Certificate of Competency Master <100m Near Coastal (NC)

What will I be able to do with this certificate? The holder of this certificate can:

- ▶ Command a vessel <100 m long and <3000 GT within the Australian Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ)
- ▶ Undertake the duties and perform the functions of a General Purpose Hand NC, Master <24 m NC and Master <45 m NC within the EEZ

How do I get this certificate?

To obtain a Master <100 m NC CoC you will need to have completed one of the following options for qualifying sea service (QSS) on commercial vessels:

While holding a Master <45 m NC (or M<35m), the applicant must have at least:

- **At least 180 days** QSS on commercial vessels ≥24 m long, including 120 days as person in charge of a navigational watch, and a completed AMSA task book, or
- **At least 360 days** QSS on commercial vessels ≥24 m long including 120 days as officer of the watch without an AMSA task book.

While holding a Mate <80 m NC or other AMSA recognised non-command certificate:

- **At least 360 days'** as officer of the watch on commercial vessels ≥24 m long and a completed AMSA task book, or
- **At least 720 days** as officer of the watch on commercial vessels ≥24 m long without an AMSA task book.

The Master <100m NC task book can be obtained from us or from some registered training organizations (RTO). To order a task book directly from us, use the following webpage:

What must I do to be eligible for a Master <100m NC CoC?

- Be at least 16 years when the certificate is issued.
- Be able to speak and understand English, including written documents.
- Evidence of QSS accrual in the form of:
 - Record of sea service form 771
 - On board sea service record from your task book
 - Letter from the vessel operator, owner, master or chief engineer detailing your sea service.
 - Approved sea service log book
- Evidence of medical fitness (including eyesight requirements):
 - Certificate of medical fitness domestic seafarers form 1850
 - Current AMSA medical (Certificate of medical fitness form 303)
- Evidence of CoC Master <45 m (NC) or Mate <80 m (NC).
- Complete a Diploma – Maritime Operations (Master <100m NC) course from a registered training organisation (RTO).
- Hold a Marine Radio – Long Range Operators Certificate of Proficiency (LROCP) issued by the Office of Maritime Communications, or higher certificate.
- Complete a HLTAID011 unit of competency Provide first aid or equivalent course.
- Pass a final assessment.

How do I keep this certificate?

To renew your certificate you must:

- Apply online with myAMSA (<https://my.amsa.gov.au/>)
- Accrue 120 days QSS, for duties of the kind to which the certificate applies, accrued in the 5 years before the application.
- Evidence of medical fitness:
 - Certificate of medical fitness domestic seafarers form 1850 or
 - Current AMSA medical (Certificate of medical fitness form 303)
- HLTAID011 unit of competency - Provide first aid or equivalent.

If you do not meet the sea service requirement you may instead:

- Complete an approved final assessment, or
- Accrue 60 days QSS in the 6 months before the application, or
- Have other approved industry experience (e.g. state or territory marine agency assessor or operational employee, fleet manager, shore- side servicing, teaching at an approved training organisation for maritime studies, marine surveyor), or
- Complete an AMSA task book since the issue of your certificate.

Possible restriction – Master <100 m (NC)

Restricted to daylight hours

If the person is colour vision deficient the certificate will be restricted to operating only within daylight hours:

How to apply for a certificate of competency – Initial issue / renewal

Apply online with myAMSA:

- Gather the required documents and a colour passport-sized photograph that meets our requirements.
- Log in to myAMSA (<https://my.amsa.gov.au/>) using your Australian Government myID.
- Fill in the application form online and upload copies of your documents.
- Pay the required fee and submit your application online.

AMSA may request reasonable evidence to confirm or verify any of the information provided as part of the application.
