SUB-SECTION F

Structural Fire Protection

Vessels must comply with the requirements contained in the <u>National Standard for Commercial Vessels</u> (NSCV) <u>Part C, Design and Construction, Section 4, Fire Safety</u>, Chapter 2, Fire Safety Outcomes and Solutions - Clause 2.9, Compliance (including Table 4 – Deemed-to-satisfy solutions) and the Marine Orders, standards, Chapters and Annexes mentioned therein, relating to passive fire protection measures.

With the following notes added to Clause 2.9, Compliance, of the referenced NSCV Part C Section 4:

NOTES:

- 2. The deemed-to-satisfy solutions contained in Table 4, and the Marine Orders, standards, Chapters and Annexes mentioned therein, include the requirements to cover both
 - Section 5, Construction, Sub-Section F, Structural Fire Protection, and
 - Section 11, Fire Appliances.
- 3. Only those parts of Table 4 and the Marine Orders, standards, Chapters and Annexes mentioned therein covering structural fire protection (passive fire protection measures) are applicable to this Section of the USL Code.
- 4. Those parts of Table 4 and the Marine Orders, standards, Chapters and Annexes mentioned therein covering fire appliances (active fire protection measures) are not applicable in Queensland.
- 5. The Chapters, Clauses and Annexes of the NSCV Part C Section 4 applicable in Queensland shall be interpreted in accordance with the NSCV Part C Section 4, Chapter 1.
