Marine safety (recording activities) Exemption 2013

I, Graham Peachey, Chief Executive Officer of the Australian Maritime Safety Authority (the National Marine Safety Regulator under section 9 of the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law)*, make this instrument under subsection 143(1) of the *Marine Safety* (*Domestic Commercial Vessel*) National Law.

1 Name of instrument

This instrument is Marine safety (recording activities) Exemption 2013.

2 Duration

This instrument:

- (a) commences when it is made; and
- (b) ceases to have effect at the end of 30 June 2016.

3 Application

This instrument applies to an operation:

- (a) that was being undertaken within the year ending on 30 June 2013; and
- (b) of a vessel that:
 - (i) is less than 7.5 m long; and
 - (ii) would be a domestic commercial vessel only because a person uses the vessel, or allows the vessel to be used, to produce a record of sporting or recreational activities associated with a vessel.

Examples of activities Fishing, diving, swimming.

4 Exemption

If the National Regulator gives written approval for the operation:

(a) the master of the vessel is exempt until 1 July 2014 from the requirement to hold a certificate of competency that would be required for the specified operation; and

- (b) the vessel used in the operation is exempt from the requirement to have:
 - (i) if the operation is in Class D or E waters a certificate of survey; and
 - (ii) until 1 February 2014 a certificate of operation.

Note 1 National Regulator is defined in the national law — see section 6.

Note 2 An application for approval can be part of the application for a certificate of operation or a separate application. For the form of application and how it will be processed, contact the National Regulator.

Note 3 A fee may be charged — see section 9 of the national law.

5 Conditions

- (1) The master of the vessel must hold:
 - (a) any licence that would be required to operate the vessel recreationally in the waters in which the operation is carried out; or
 - (b) a certificate of competency that entitles the person to be the master of the vessel.
- (2) The National Regulator may make the approval subject to further conditions that take account of the local conditions of the waters in which the vessel is to operate.
