## Marine Safety (Lifejacket lights) Exemption 2025

## 1 Name of instrument

This instrument is Marine Safety (Lifejacket lights) Exemption 2025.

### 2 Duration

This instrument commences on 1 July 2025 and ceases to have effect at the end of 30 June 2028.

#### 3 Definitions

In this instrument:

*Class 1C vessel* means a vessel that has the vessel use category 1 under section 2.1 of NSCV Part B.

*Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law* — see Schedule 1 to the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law Act 2012.* 

Note National Regulator is defined in the Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law — see section 6.

Note **Domestic commercial vessel** is defined in the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law* — see section 7.

*NSCV* — see section 6 of the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law*, meaning of *National Standard for Commercial Vessels*.

NSCV Part B means Part B — General requirements of the NSCV.

NSCV Part C means Part C — Design and construction of the NSCV.

# 4 Exemption

- (1) A domestic commercial vessel that is a Class 1C vessel is exempt from the requirement in Table 2 of NSCV Subsection C7A for a lifejacket to have a light that complies with Annex A of the subsection.
- (2) However, subsection (1) does not apply to each lifejacket provided for the master and crew of the vessel.
