Marine Safety (Extension of time — certificates of competency) Exemption 2020 (No. 2)

1 Name of instrument

This instrument is *Marine Safety (Extension of time — certificates of competency) Exemption 2020 (No. 2)*.

2 Duration

This instrument commences when it is made.

3 Repeal

Marine Safety (Extension of time — certificates of competency) Exemption 2020 made on 2 April 2020 is repealed.

4 Definitions

In this instrument:

Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law — see Schedule 1 to the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law Act 2012*.

Note **National Regulator** is defined in the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law* — see section 6.

5 Exemption

- (1) A person is exempt from the requirement to hold a certificate of competency of a particular kind if:
 - (a) the person held a certificate of that kind that was expressed to expire between 26 March 2020 and 31 January 2021; and
 - (b) on the date the certificate was expressed to expire, the certificate was not suspended or revoked.
- (2) The exemption is for the period that:
 - (a) commences the day after the certificate of competency expired; and
 - (b) ends on the earlier of:
 - (i) 12 months after the certificate of competency expires; or
 - (ii) 31 July 2021; or
 - (ii) the day that the National Regulator issues a certificate of competency.
- (3) The exemption is subject to the condition that a person must comply with any conditions that were attached to the expired certificate.
